



CUBO Golf Course - LOCAL RULES



A-1 Out Of Bounds

Out of bounds is defined by wooden fence posts (except for the wooden fences that are defined as Immovable Obstructions, see F-17) and / or the line between the course-side points at ground level of white stakes. **Wooden fence posts which define OB are boundary objects and integral part of the course. No relief available.**

A-4 Internal Out of Bounds

During play of hole No. 2, the fairway of the hole No. 4, on the left side, defined by a line of white-green stakes, is out of bounds. The line ends at connection with red penalty area on hole No. 4.

These stakes are treated as boundary objects during the play of hole No. 2. For all other holes, they are immovable obstructions.

During play of hole No. 7, the fairway of the hole No.8, on the right side, defined by a line of white-green stakes, is out of bounds. The line ends at connection with red penalty area on hole No. 8.

These stakes are treated as boundary objects during the play of hole No. 7. For all other holes, they are immovable obstructions.

E-1.3 Dropping zones

During play of hole No. 12, if the player's ball lies in the abnormal ground condition near the green No. 12, or this area interferes with player's stance, the player may play the ball as it lies or :

- Take stroke-and-distance relief under Rule 18.1, adding **one penalty stroke**, or
- Take **free** relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in the nearest dropping zone near the green No. 12. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3. **Player may not choose any other free relief option.**

If the player's ball lies in the abnormal ground condition near the green No. 15, marked with blue line, or this area interferes with player's stance, the player may play the ball as it lies or :

- Take stroke-and-distance relief under Rule 18.1, adding **one penalty stroke**, or
- Take **free** relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in the dropping zone near the green No. 15. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3. **Player may not choose any other free relief option.**

E-3 Preferred Lies

When a player's ball lies in a part of the General Area cut to fairway height or less, the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball or another ball in and playing it from the relief area within **ONE CLUB length** located in the General Area and no closer to the hole than the Reference Point which is the spot of the original ball.

E-8.2 No Play Zone

The whole area within the red penalty area defined by red stakes with black tops on the left of hole 15 is a **no play zone** that is treated as a red penalty area and penalty relief must be taken from interference by the no play zone under Rule 17.1e.

E-10 Protection of Young Trees

The young trees identified by supporting stakes are no play zones.

If a player's ball lies anywhere on the course other than in a penalty area and it lies on or touches such a tree or such a tree interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, **the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f.**

E-11 Ball Deflected by Power Line

If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line or tower or a wire or pole supporting a power line, and this happened on the course during the play of holes 14 and 15, the stroke does not count. The player must replay the stroke by playing the original ball or another ball from the spot where that stroke was made (see Rule 14.6). If the player replays the stroke but does so from a wrong place, they get the **general penalty** under Rule 14.7. If the player does not replay the stroke, they get the **general penalty** and the stroke counts, but the player has not played from a wrong place.

F-11 Ant Hills

Large or hard ant hills on the course are, at the player's option, loose impediments that may be removed under Rule 15.1 or ground under repair (Anywhere on Course except when ball is in Penalty Area) from which relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.

F-17 Immovable Obstructions

All roads and paths on the course, even if not artificially surfaced, as well as the wooden fences between holes 1 and 4, and holes 2 and 3, are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.
